I saw the most recent film, Star Trek: Beyond, in 3. 8 theatres, and I also purchased the collector's edition of Star Trek: Beyond on pre-9 10 order. Prior to viewing Star Trek: Beyond, I watched the fan film, Prelude to 4. 11 Axanar. The fan film rekindled my interest in the Star Trek franchise, and I purchased 12 additional official, Star Trek-licensed props and costumes following its release, 13 including, but not limited to: (a) The Original Series [TOS] phaser, communicator, 14 and tricorder; (b) an Anovos tunic; and (c) Blue-Ray remasters. 15 I specifically made these purchases, worth several hundred dollars, 16 because Prelude to Axanar rekindled my interest in the Star Trek franchise, and would 17 not have these purchases but for watching the fan film. 18 19 I declare under the penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct. 
