
EXHIBIT 1 TO WATKINS DECLARATION



The emails take a back burner to the real backbreaker in Axanar's victory--CBS/P are now under a court order to demonstrate EXACTLY how a twentyminute fan film damaged them in ANY way, financially. Of course they won't be able to, because even if every single dollar donated were a protest dollar deliberately spent to injure CBS, Beyond pulled in \$300 million at the box office. \$1.3 million is a third of one percent of that, and well within any margin of doubt. That's not even counting the merchandising and video income yet to roll in. That's the best possible case for the plaintiffs, and it isn't even close to being true. I saw Bevond in the theater, have the collector edition of the BluRay on pre-order, and I didn't even particularly LIKE the movie all that well. However...

BECAUSE of Prelude to Axanar, my interest in Star Trek has been renewed. Since it came out, I've purchased quite a few licensed products, like TOS phaser, communicator, tricorder, models, BluRay remasters, and a \$200 Anovos tunic, which I probably wouldn't have if it weren't for Axanar. All together, I've spent more on licensed Star Trek Merchandise than I donated in all three crowdfunding rounds put together. So that's pretty much it for the ideal "protest dollar" theory.

Am I alone here? Did Axanar rekindle anyone else's love for Star Trek? More importantly, before all this lawsuit junk, did Axanar stop you from buying Trek stuff, or get you to buy MORE?
